



# 2021 COUNCIL ELECTIONS – CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

## Notice to College Members

---

October 20, 2021

The College is holding an election from November 10 to December 1, 2021 to fill 3 seats on Council.

2 of these 3 seats are in the medical electoral division of the region comprising the City of Mount Pearl and the City of St. John's and 1 is in the medical electoral division representing the remainder of the Province.

### Who is eligible to run and vote?

To be eligible to run for election and vote for a candidate, a physician must:

- Hold a full or provisional licence to practise medicine in Newfoundland and Labrador

### Nomination Process

To nominate a candidate:

1. Go to [www.cpsnl.ca](http://www.cpsnl.ca) > About > [Council Elections](#) and complete the nomination form. The completed form must include:
  - Nomination by two physicians who live or work in the appropriate medical electoral division, and
  - Acceptance of the nomination by the candidate.
2. Provide a short biography of the candidate (maximum two paragraphs).
3. Submit the completed nomination package (nomination form and biography) to the College.

**The deadline for nominations is Friday, November 5, 2021 at 12:30 pm**

## **Voting**

If there are more candidates than available seats, the College will hold an election conducted by an online voting system.

The College will forward the names and biographies of candidates and instructions regarding the online voting system to College members on November 9, 2021.
