

New & Updated Standards of Practice

The College is pleased to share with our Members and Stakeholders two (2) new and two (2) updated **<u>Standards of Practice</u>**.

Earlier in 2024, the College sought feedback from CPSNL Licenced Physicians, NLHS, NLMA, CMPA, NLHRN, and Members of the Public. The College received over 250 responses total representing a wide range of demographic perspectives. This feedback was analyzed, and key items were identified and included in the creation or updating of: **Establishing and Ending the Physician-Patient Relationship, Consent to Treatment,** and **Interdisciplinary Care & Delegation of Tasks**. Concurrently, the College created a new Standard of Practice that aligns with other regulators, **Observing or Shadowing a Physician**.

Establishing and Ending the Physician-Patient Relationship	 Patient Selection Process: exceptions to first-come, first-served approach Definition of establishing the Physician-Patient relationship Physician-patient relationship - natural/expected conclusion situations (i.e. "walk-in" care) Reasonable and unreasonable grounds to end the relationship (i.e. relationship breakdown, patient moved away, or reducing practice size)
<u>Consent to</u> <u>Treatment</u>	 Capacity and authority to provide consent including substitute decision makers and a minor's capacity for consent Disputes and consensus Adequate information for informed consent (i.e. diagnosis, treatment, outcomes, risk, consequences of treatment refusal, alternative treatment, and trainee delegation) When express oral or written consent is required Consent documentation Delegating consent Medical emergencies and involuntary admission
Interdisciplinary Care & Delegation of Tasks	 Interdisciplinary team responsibility and accountability Physician delegation of tasks Medical Orders and Directives - written and verbal
Observing or Shadowing a Physician	 Observer registration and licensure requirements Approval to act as an Observer and scope Confidentiality Patient understanding and consent
