

# RCPSC Practice Eligibility Route to Licensure

**Licensing Policy** 

This policy outlines the minimum certification requirements for obtaining a Provisional Licence – Specialty Practice through the Royal College of Physician and Surgeons of Canada's (RCPSC) Practice Eligibility Route (PER).

#### **Preamble**

For specialist applicants applying for licensure via the RCPSC's PER, proof of primary specialty exam eligibility is required to meet the minimum certification requirement to be issued a Provisional Licence – Specialty Practice.

#### Scope

This policy focuses specifically on specialist applicants who are applying for licensure through the RCPSC's PER.

## **Policy**

In addition to meeting all other licensing criteria, an applicant for a Provisional Licence – Specialty Practice via the RCPSC's PER must:

- 1. Provide proof of eligibility for a RCPSC primary certification written examination; and
- 2. As a condition of licensure, obtain RCPSC certification in the primary specialty within 5 (five) years of the issuance of a Provisional Licence Specialty Practice obtained via the RCPSC's PER.
